Question 3

Romans 8:29-39; See day 6

THIRD DAY

Read Romans 8:29-30

[29] For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.
[30] And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified.

Question 6

John 6:37, 44; [37] All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away.

[44] “No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him, and I will raise him up at the last day.

Romans 1:6-7; 3:22-26; 8:17-21; [6] And you also are among those who are called to belong to Jesus Christ.

[7] To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints:

[22] This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, [23] for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, [24] and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. [25] God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished — [26] he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus.

[17] Now if we are children, then we are heirs — heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

[18] I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. [19] The creation waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed. [20] For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope [21] that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of the children of God.

Ephesians 1:4-5, 11; [4] For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love [5] he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will—

[11] In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will,

Question 7

Romans 5:3-5; [3] Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; [4] perseverance, character; and character, hope. [5] And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.

[8] For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not have spoken later about another day.

FOURTH DAY

Read Romans 8:31-35

[31] What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us? [32] He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? [33] Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. [34] Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus, who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. [35] Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?
